Purchasing MREs

Working with a supplier, UCCA purchased 20,000 MREs – Meal, Ready-to-Eat (MRE) to assist our freedom fighters.

The MREs are self-contained, individual field rations packed in a lightweight package for service members to use in combat when other food is not available.

The MREs are designed for maximum endurance and nutrition with an average of 1250 calories per meal.

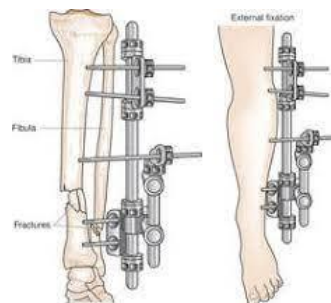

Sharing UCCA's Story

UCCA's Executive Director, Tamara Olexy, was invited to participate in a virtual event marking Women's History Month hosted by **Governor Phil Murphy and First Lady Tammy Murphy** of the great state of New Jersey.



Thank you, New Jersey, for allowing UCCA to share our Ukrainian story – the critical role women are playing in Ukraine today, and an overview of UCCA's Humanitarian Aid efforts.

Leveraging our contacts, UCCA was able to procure and organize 111 pallets of donated **medical supplies, worth over \$590,000**. The first 24 pallets of these medicines, destined for Ukraine, departs on April 2nd.

UCCA Continues to **support AICM-Ukraine** in their efforts to deliver vital medical and pharmaceutical supplies, as well as basic necessities to the most vulnerable. One such example is the city of Sumy, which has been isolated for weeks. AICM was able to deliver 70 tons of aid to them.
